Course Objective

Material Covered:

This service provides psychiatric consultations to adult inpatients at Memorial Hermann Hospital. Pathologies encountered include mood illnesses, anxiety-spectrum illnesses, and neurocognitive disorders including delirium and dementia. Rotation objectives include gaining proficiency in performing a psychiatric interview, improving psychiatric differential diagnosis, and improving documentation and case presentation skills. The student will ultimately be expected to perform primary assessments independently and manage an existing caseload of 3-4 patients.

Skills Acquired:

The service affords the student the opportunity to participate in the process of coordinating our psychiatric treatment with the needs of the hospital staff and the primary treatment team.
