Utilized evidence-based interventions including CBT, ACT, DBT, and MI. Evaluated patients in response to attending physicians' referral question in order to facilitate treatment planning and care. In this setting, also provided training to graduate level practicum students and psychology interns, and psychiatry residents through case conference discussions, direct teaching, and clinical supervision.
